A historical fact

Harold Moody, arrived in **Bristol** from **Jamaica** in 1904, determined to become a doctor. He graduated in 1912, and following rejections - on account of his race - from King's College Hospital and the Camberwell Board of Guardians, Harold established a private practice in **Peckham**.

His position made him a champion for Black people in the 1920s and 30s. With momentum building behind him, Harold formed one of twentieth-century Britain's first anti-racism campaigns, the League of Coloured Peoples, in 1931.



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
