Physician Associate Managed Voluntary Register

The Physician Associate Managed Voluntary Register (PAMVR) is a register of fully qualified physician associates who have been declared fit to practise in the UK.

The PAMVR is held by the Faculty of Physician Associates (FPA) and it allows supervisors and employers to check whether a physician associate is qualified and safe to work.





Why is the PAMVR important?

By managing the PAMVR, the FPA:

- > ensures patient safety
- > sets standards for postgraduate education and development
- > advances statutory regulation for physician associates.

The physician associate profession is not yet subject to statutory regulation, so the PAMVR is a vital development in ensuring patient safety.

How does a physician associate apply to join the PAMVR?

By applying for FPA membership and meeting all the eligibility criteria, fully qualified physician associates can become registered on the PAMVR.
