Do you have project management experience? Would you like to lead an important and exciting new project? We are recruiting a **Project Manager** on a fixed term contract (**full time** for **18 months** at **AFC Band 7**) to join and support our growing, busy and friendly **Training Hub team**.

The **General Practice Non-Clinical Development (GPNC)** project is vital to the future sustainability of General Practice. There has been minimal national or local activity to develop non-clinical general practice staff and associated management roles, that equate to 50% of the general practice workforce. The project aims to create career paths to enable **long-term recruitment** and **development** of non-clinical roles. It will also enable pragmatic access to associated training & development provision and recommend ongoing support. **Excellent stakeholder management**, **communication** and **influencing skills** will be a pre-requisite of this role.

The role will be employed by the **BNSSG Training Hub**. You will take responsibility for delivering the GPNC project and for the accurate definition, communication, resourcing, delivery, reporting and evaluation.

Employing an FCP

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For FCPs and Practice Management staff

Understanding First Contact Practitioners (FCPs) educational pathways

The state of the s

& supervision requirements

Allied Health Professionals (AHPs) employed as FCPs are Physiotherapists, Paramedics, Occupational Therapists, Dieticians and Podiatrists. A First Contact Practitioner (FCP) is a diagnostic AHP working in Primary Care at a Masters Level (L7) and has at least 5 years post-graduate experience. They work with undifferentiated/undiagnosed presentations and with uncertainty.

All additional roles in **Primary Care** require varying supervision including **Network DES Contract ARRS Annex B**, the **CQC myth buster** and **NHSE guidance**. FCPs should complete the Roadmap to practice as per the DES ARRS Annex B and the CQC Myth buster. They can enrol on a **nationally accredited program**, including a Taught Route or a Supported e-portfolio route. FCPs apply to universities with funded FCP places which cover stage 1 & 2 of the FCP Roadmap.

Portfolio routes and taught routes include support from Universities, cover stage 1 & 2 of the Roadmap and both require a local supervisor.

Principles of Primary Care (CPD) Course

For all Allied Health Professionals & Primary Care Staff



Public Health and **Primary Care** provide the foundation for successfully managed healthcare for populations across the world from birth through to old age. Primary Care is 'the most efficient form of care and the chosen way to deliver health for all' (World Health Organisation), but sometimes there is a lack of understanding about its core principles and the evidence behind its effectiveness. Learning about these **key principles** will contribute to practitioners' **knowledge** and **confidence** in this specialisation. For policymakers, it may demystify some of publicity around primary care and general practice.

This **one-day** course provides a unique insight into **practical solutions** to some of the challenges faced every day across Primary Care and can help health professionals to make a meaningful impact in their communities – whether based in the UK or in other countries. We will explore the **core concepts** of both primary care and its crossover into public health, providing an **integrated perspective**. Participants will be offered a toolkit of practical skills enabling them to apply the learning in practice.

The available dates are Tuesday **16 April** & Tuesday **14 May**, either via Zoom or **St Lukes Campus, University of Exeter**.



Continuing Professional Development (CPD)

For all Allied Health Professionals & Support Workers

Provided by the NHS England workforce, training & education directorate for 2024

The BNSSG Training Hub has been reviewing the remaining Continuing Professional Development (CPD) allocation which needs to be utilised in the financial year 2023/2024. We appreciate system pressures may be inhibiting individuals to access CPD however if this funding is not spent by the end of the financial year it will need to be returned to NHS England (NHSE) and will be lost.

This funding is allocated by NHS England for professional's personal development budget. It is calculated using the data that you have reported on the **National Workforce Reporting Service** (NWRS). The funding allocation is **£333.33** and we do not have access to funding beyond this amount. You may wish to apply for educational grants from other organisations if the cost of your course exceeds the allocation.

The funding can be used for any accredited or non-accredited professional development. This can include virtual & face to face training, events, conferences, university & other Higher Education Institute (HEI) modules. The education needs to be relevant to the role and in line with the needs of the practice/PCN. Please note you should not utilise CPD funding for statutory & mandatory training or backfill of staff.



In May 2023, the government agreed a deal for the **AfC workforce** through the **NHS Staff Council**. During negotiations, concerns were raised about how the AfC pay structure is affecting the career progression and professional development of nurses, and the direct impact that this is having on recruitment and retention. The **Royal College of Nursing** (RCN) suggested that a separate pay spine for nursing staff could address these concerns.

The government published a press release to explore these specific concerns, to understand the **benefits** and **challenges** of a **separate nursing pay spine**, and to explore other potential approaches to addressing any issues identified. This exploration does not form part of the AfC deal that was agreed with the NHS Staff Council. This call for **evidence** is open to **everyone**. You can respond on behalf of an **organisation**, as an **individual member** of the **health and care workforce**, and as an **individual** that is **not a member** of the health and care workforce.

It is important we **engage** and **utilise** this opportunity to feedback, giving voice to the impact this could have on registered **Health Care Professions**, our collective workforce and individuals, regardless of various union perspectives yet to unfold.

University of Bath MPharm Undergraduate Placements 2023 - 24

For **Pharmacy** and **Practice Management Staff**

Providing students experience in general practice

University of Bath's **MPharm programme** provides students additional experience in clinical settings, to better prepare them for undertaking prescribing training in their **Foundation Training** year in 2025.

The 2023 - 24 programme began last October and offered a number of placements in **general practice** settings. To be able to provide more, the university is working with NHS England (NHSE), pharmacy workforce leads, and the Universities of Reading and Portsmouth to increase capacity and capability in the system. They are also looking for **practice surgeries** to **host placements**.

To this end, if your practice is willing to support this work, please contact the University of Bath's **Director of Practice Based Learning**, **Lyn Hanning**, as soon as you can.

Here are a few key points about the **MPharm programme**:

- Clinical tariff will be paid by NHSE to support placements
- University of Bath will provide accommodation and travel subsistence
- The **feedback** from **last year's** GP placements was **very positive** -- **over 95%** of students felt better informed of their future path.
