Wellbeing in GP Appraisals

BNSSG Training Hub and NHS England

BNSSG Training Hub and NHS England are expanding a successful Devon pilot to better support GP wellbeing through the appraisal process.

Appraisers have been trained to hold sensitive, supportive wellbeing conversations and can now signpost GPs to new services including professional coaching, mindfulness training, peer support groups, and GP mentor discussions. These options complement existing services and aim to help GPs prioritise their own wellbeing amid increasing pressures.


Not everyone had time to respond — but whether you shared feedback or not, we want to show how your experiences, input, and needs are shaping the future of our work.

- Thank you for taking the time to contribute.


What You Use


